News from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

This half term has seen some big events for Shenfield High School. Ofsted visited us on the 23rd and 24th April and I look forward to sharing the outcome with you when the final report is published. Suffice to say at this point that the inspection process was very positive and there was much agreement between the inspection team and school leaders about the strengths and areas for further development of Shenfield High School. One thing I think I can share is a comment made by the inspection team that they had met so many polite and respectful students during their time at the school; your children were an absolute credit to you.

Alongside the report we will also, next half term, be sharing with you some changes to key policies from September 2024 on the grouping of students in core subjects, our assessment reporting procedures, and our homework policy. These are all areas where discussion has taken place between all stakeholders, including our students, and I thank those parents who have shared their views with me on these areas since my start at Shenfield. We believe that these changes will strongly support the academic success of our students and their ability to achieve their very best outcomes.

Our Year 11 and Year 13 students are now in the full swing of GCSE and A level examinations. It is fair to say that the students have approached their examinations very positively and the mood outside the exam venues remains optimistic. I wish to congratulate them all for their efforts so far, encourage them to have some downtime next week but also to use the time wisely in adopting a little and often approach to their revision.

The personal development of our students is something that I believe we excel in at Shenfield and this newsletter is full of examples of that.

- You can read about the extensive opportunities our students have had to explore career paths and future options, encountering employers and external providers.
- Our CCF is the largest contingent of its type within a state secondary school and provides so much opportunity for students from years 9 and above to develop soft skills, attain leadership qualifications and have experiences that are unique to them. A significant focus of the CCF is also about community, about giving back, and you can read about their fundraising for the British Legion within this newsletter.

- I wish to congratulate our Performing Arts Team for attaining the Artsmark Gold Award. You can read quotes from the assessors which very clearly communicate the strength of provision within this area of the school. Many of you will have enjoyed performances at this school and so will know firsthand about the strength and depth of talent amongst our students. Well done to everyone involved in this achievement.
- And finally, we couldn't put a newsletter out this week and not mention the football. For those of you who may not know, on Monday four of our teams played in the finals of the ESFA National Schools Cup. Four teams in the finals and four wins; an absolutely unprecedented achievement! That will be a day that the young people (and staff) will never forget. Congratulations to all of them for their successes on the day but also for all the hard work that got them there.

Behind all these strengths and successes are staff who give up so much of their time inside and outside of the school day in training, rehearsing, planning, organising and supporting the students. A huge thankyou to all of them.



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UKMT Maths Challenge for Years 7 & 8

Students from Years 7 and 8 took part in the UKMT Junior Maths Challenge. This exam is sat by thousands of schools each year and tests student's mathematical problem-solving skills.

As a school, we saw an increase from last year in the number of students receiving bronze, silver and gold certificates. In total 30 Year 7 students and 45 Year 8 students received a certificate which is fantastic.

A special mention goes to Harley R, Levi J & Kyron H in Y8 who were invited to take part in a further challenge due to their exceptional performance.

RISE Easter Cakes

RISE students have been studying Ratio and Proportion as part of the KS3 Maths Curriculum. They put this into practice working out how much of each ingredient they needed to make different numbers of cakes.

We then went to the Food Tech room and weighed out the ingredients for 12 Easter cakes each. The students followed a recipe, decorated them and put them in the fridge to set overnight. These were then served to their families at Parents' evening, with both Mr Rigg and Miss Smith sampling the cakes too.



Food Preparation and Nutrition Clubs

The clubs for Food Preparation and Nutrition students have been running this half term and are open to all Year 9 students who have selected Food as an option for next year and to Year 10 students currently taking the course.

Both groups have been developing their higherlevel technical skills for their practical exam that comes at the end of Year 11.

Year 9 students who have chosen Food Preparation and Nutrition attend lunchtimes on Friday and manage to achieve a lot in just 40 minutes.

Year 10 students attend the club on Tuesday after school and have a little longer to perfect the preparing, making and presenting of different aspects of their technical skills.



U13 Boys Essex Cup Champions

Our Year 8 boys football squad were looking to defend the Essex Cup title they won last season and in progressing to the cup final again this season, they remarkably did so, without conceding a single goal.

This year's County Cup final was against Woodlands School, Basildon. Our opposition applied early pressure but as they started to tire our passing football enabled us to gain more control of the game as it progressed. Jude L produced some scintillating skills to break free down the right wing before rattling a half volley against the crossbar from twenty yards. Woodlands created one good chance and Finley C produced a great block to deny them.

The second half saw Shenfield maintain their control of the game and it was Tom A who scored the opener five minutes into the half, Egor causing a nuisance at the near post getting the flick to Tom who scored at the back post. Emmanuel O came on at that point and he was too powerful for the Woodlands defence. He created a few chances and was fouled on two such occasions to stop his from breaking free in the box. With 10 minutes to go Emmanuel broke free of the defence before setting up Jude to smash the ball across the keeper and into the net.

Shenfield's defence were impeccable in dealing with Woodlands' direct approach as the game towards its conclusion. As the final whistle went they were proud to defend the Essex Cup title (having also defended the Essex Cup Basketball title in March) but also to go the whole campaign without conceding one goal.

This year group are producing incredible results in a wide range of sports. It is no coincidence that they have impeccable attitudes and an excellent work ethic which makes them a real pleasure to teach and coach.

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Shenfield Girls Football on Fire

Shenfield's girls football has long been highly regarded both across the county and the country but the achievements of our girls this season has superseded anything that has gone before.

Our girls teams reached every Essex Cup final that is competed for. Our U16 girls finished runners-up to Fitzwimarc having missed key players through injury but the U13 girls got the ball rolling, winning their final 6-0 against Redden Court.

The U14 girls got revenge on Fitzwimarc winning 6-1 with Lucy E scoring a hat-trick, Maisie B scoring two and Poppy H also on the scoresheet.

This final was immediately followed by the U12 girls final with our Year 7 girls also facing a strong Fitzwimarc side. That game followed a similar pattern as the U14 final with Shenfield dominating the early exchanges and scoring early through a fine finish from Elsie S.

Elsie scored her second five minutes later when she finished first time from a Sophia G corner. Sophia added the third goal herself just before half-time.

The second half was a more even contest with Shenfield's defence put under more pressure, especially from long kicks and long throw-ins but the Shenfield defenders and keeper Mimi W dealt so well with the direct approach used.

Sophia smashed home her second and Shenfield's fourth with ten minutes left to seal the win and make it a hat-trick of girls Essex Cup football titles.

With our U18 girls side also being National Cup semi-finalists and the U13 and U14 girls playing in National finals next week at West Brom it really has been a superb year for the girls, irrespective of the results in these two National finals.

The U13 and U14 girls have certainly done everything possible to be prepared for completing the 'Double-Double'!







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U16 Boys B Football ESFA National Cup Runners-Up

Our Year 11 boys and girls football teams have enjoyed considerable success since they started at Shenfield back in 2019.

The strength in depth, especially amongst the boys, meant the boys B team have been very strong. They lost in the National Cup quarter final when they were in Year 7 to Whitgift (1-0) and to the same team by the same margin at the same stage in Year 9. In Year 10 they lost 1-2 away at Taunton Academy School after reaching the National Cup semi-final.

So this season they were desperate to go all the way. They have certainly come on as players in the last twelve months and progressed more comfortably through the competition up to the semi-final stage where they were again drawn away at Taunton. However, this year the boys played superbly to come away 1-0 winners to defeat the reigning National Champions and progress to their first ever National final.

Our boys met Cardinal Heenan in the final at Stoke City's stadium. Cardinal Heenan have Steven Gerrard as one of their most famous alumni and with a rich history of success in National competitions the game was always going to be challenging. That certainly proved the case in the first ten minutes when Heenan's direct approach caught Shenfield cold. Their skilful and pacy forward C Navarro putting our opponents ahead 1-0. Luke H came off the bench to help deal with Navarro's threat and he made a positive impact as Shenfield got a foothold in the game. Just before half time Albie D did well to hold the ball up before feeding Zack H to set up our skipper Freddy P, who turned three Heenan players with one superb fake, before putting the ball in the top corner from twenty yards with his weaker left foot!

The second half was a close and cagey battle, Shenfield producing the best of the football with Heenan looking to go long at every option to set Navarro free. Twenty minutes into the half Alfie C stayed on his feet when fouled before Freddy P was pushed in the back and lost possession but no call was made. With our team out of shape, Navarro received the ball before setting up his team mate to slot past Aaron B.

They should all look back on a memorable five years of football memories, in which they have grown as footballers and as young men. Not everything in life works out with a happy ending but this squad of boys have shown they are well equipped to be very successful in dealing with what life throws at them.





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National Champions

The U12 boys put in a stellar performance to win the National Cup in their first year at Shenfield. They ran riot first half going 3-0 up with goals from Ed, Alfie and Brandon and went in at half time three goals ahead. It was an unbelievable first half performance and some of the best football played all season by these boys. A penalty decision resulted in a Wright Robinson goal before Shay sealed the National title, adding a fourth to run away 4-1 winners.

Wright Robinson were always a threat, especially through their number 10 who plays at Liverpool. However, it was George C who broke the deadlock from a perfectly flighted free-kick that Daniel O attacked and did enough to put off the keeper so he could not keep the ball out. Minutes later, from an almost identical free-kick, George again flighted the cross over the defence and this time Daniel did get his head to the ball first to guide the ball past the Robinson keeper.

Wright Robinson were not deterred. They got back into the game after 25 minutes when a right wing cross was met on the half volley and Chris L could not get enough on the shot to keep it out. Robinson then equalised from a fine strike from 20 yards to put the teams level going in at half-time. The second half was again equally matched but Shenfield got their noses in front when Daniel scored his second from an excellent first time finish. However, Robinson got back into the game when given a soft penalty and scored to make it 3-3. Despite some nervous moments, Shenfield took the game to penalties and were confident that keeper Chris would be the hero. He certainly was that, conceding only one penalty while Shenfield scored 3 to retain their National title.


