
#### The 4 categories are:

Key Stage 4 credits are rewarded to students that are engaging with learning in the classroom, being a positive role model and excellent Shenfield student within the school community. Points to Prom are rewarded to students who are completing anything extra for their studies, this may be revision sessions, past papers etc.

Students and staff are continually being updated with the information for where students are and how far they need to go to be successful. Continued communication around this narrative is really encouraging students to invest into the initiative, which is then having a positive impact on Year 11 engagement and overall attitude around the school.



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## **Expanding Opportunities!**

Our Aspirational Learning Pathway (ALP) is going from strength to strength, with two sessions now running for our enthusiastic students.

A group of 26 Year 8 students are currently working with Mr. Miller in preparation for the UK Maths Challenge 2025. They have been tackling some seriously tricky mathematical problems and will soon have the chance to compete against other local schools as part of a dedicated ALP maths team.

Meanwhile, 29 Year 7 students have been sharpening their debating skills with Mr. Rees-Gildea. They have been split into teams, assigned thought-provoking topics, and are now deep in preparation for their upcoming debates—we can't wait to see their arguments in action!

Looking ahead, both year groups will explore politics and psychology next half term, offering them even more exciting learning opportunities beyond the curriculum. Well done to all our ALP students for their hard work and enthusiasm!

## Year 8 Scholars Explore the Cold War!

14 of our Year 8 students are currently taking part in The Scholar's Programme run by The Brilliant Club, an exciting initiative designed to stretch and challenge high-achieving students.

Led by Dr. Les Newsome from King's College London, the programme focuses on the Cold War period, covering key topics such as communism vs capitalism, the Cuban Missile Crisis, the threat of nuclear war, and the Vietnam War.

Through face-to-face tutorials, our students are developing their analytical thinking and engaging in seminar-style learning—just like university students! At the end of the programme, they will complete a project demonstrating their understanding of this fascinating period. The experience will culminate in a visit to a competitive university, where they will celebrate their achievements at a special graduation ceremony while also getting a taste of university life.

So far, the students have thoroughly enjoyed exploring a period of history not covered in the school curriculum, and we can't wait to see their final projects!

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## European Jiu-Jitsu IBJJF Championship 2025

Major Robin Maynard Rtd. former 7 Para RHA British Army officer and now a valued staff member at Shenfield High School, running the Combined Cadet Force (CCF) and the PIC, competed in this year's European Championships being held in Lisbon Portugal.

This year's European championships had the biggest number of entrants ever, with 6000 competitors over 7 weight brackets in 5 belt grades; white, blue, purple, brown, and finally black belt.

Unlike some martial arts, a black belt in Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu (BJJ) is earned over a long period of time with the following as a time guideline in earning your Belt: white belt to blue belt taking 2 years, blue belt to purple Belt taking 4 years, purple belt to brown belt 4 more years, and finally brown belt to black belt 5 years. On average 15 years to get a black belt in BJJ

Success for Mr Maynard followed wining bronze in a very tough division, losing out to the overall group winner and now European Champion in the Semi Finals. Major Robin Maynard Rtd then entered the open weight category where his first fight was against the superheavy weight opponent 62Kg Vs 115Kg. It's fair to say he lost but tried hard not to be squashed!


